Moisture is not a feeling or just a visual effect.

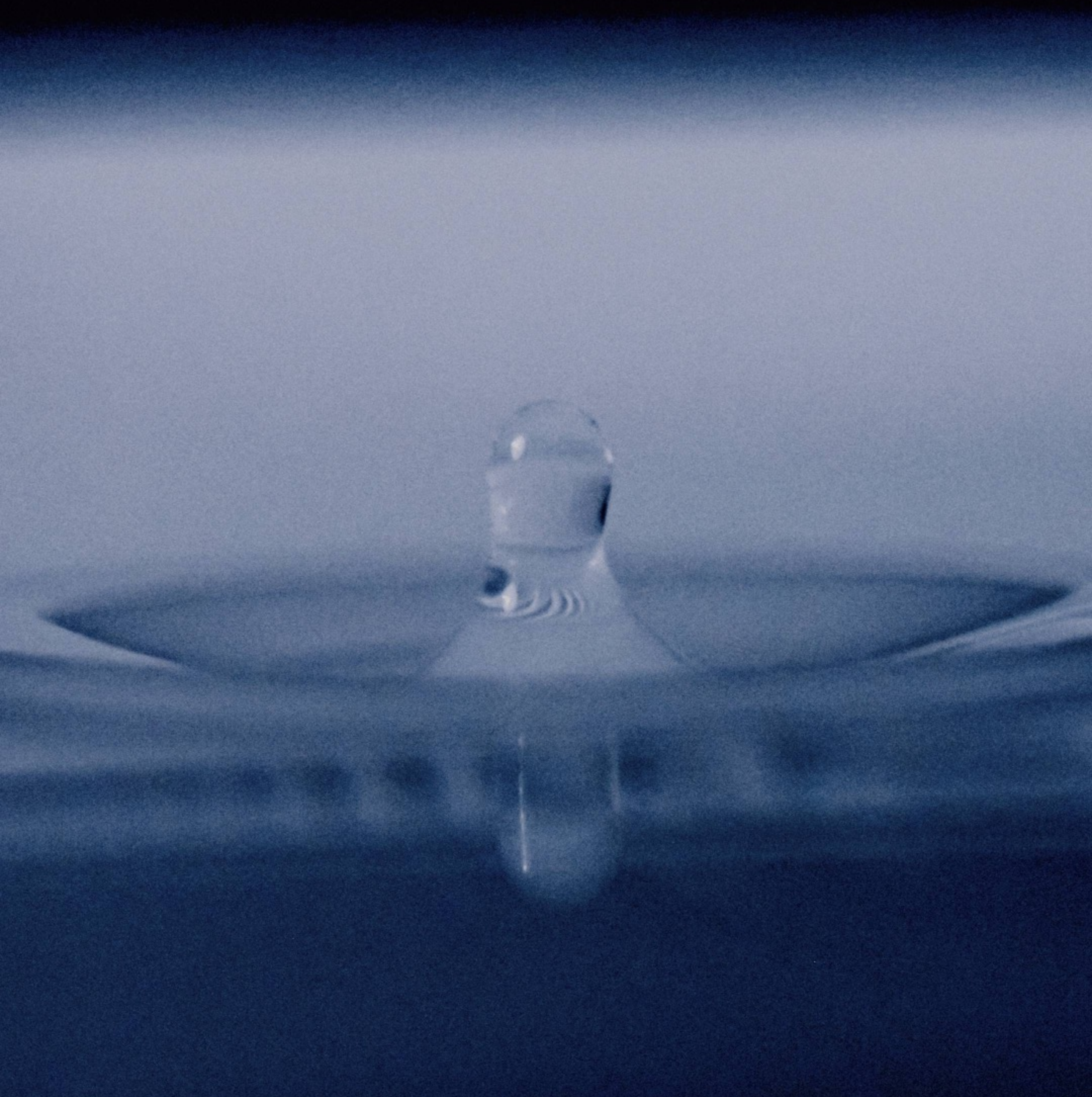
It reflects how the skin keeps the look of firmness, elasticity, and resilience.

Hydro Capture



The skin draws in and holds water.

Effect: the feeling of dryness is reduced, leaving skin feeling more comfortable and refreshed.

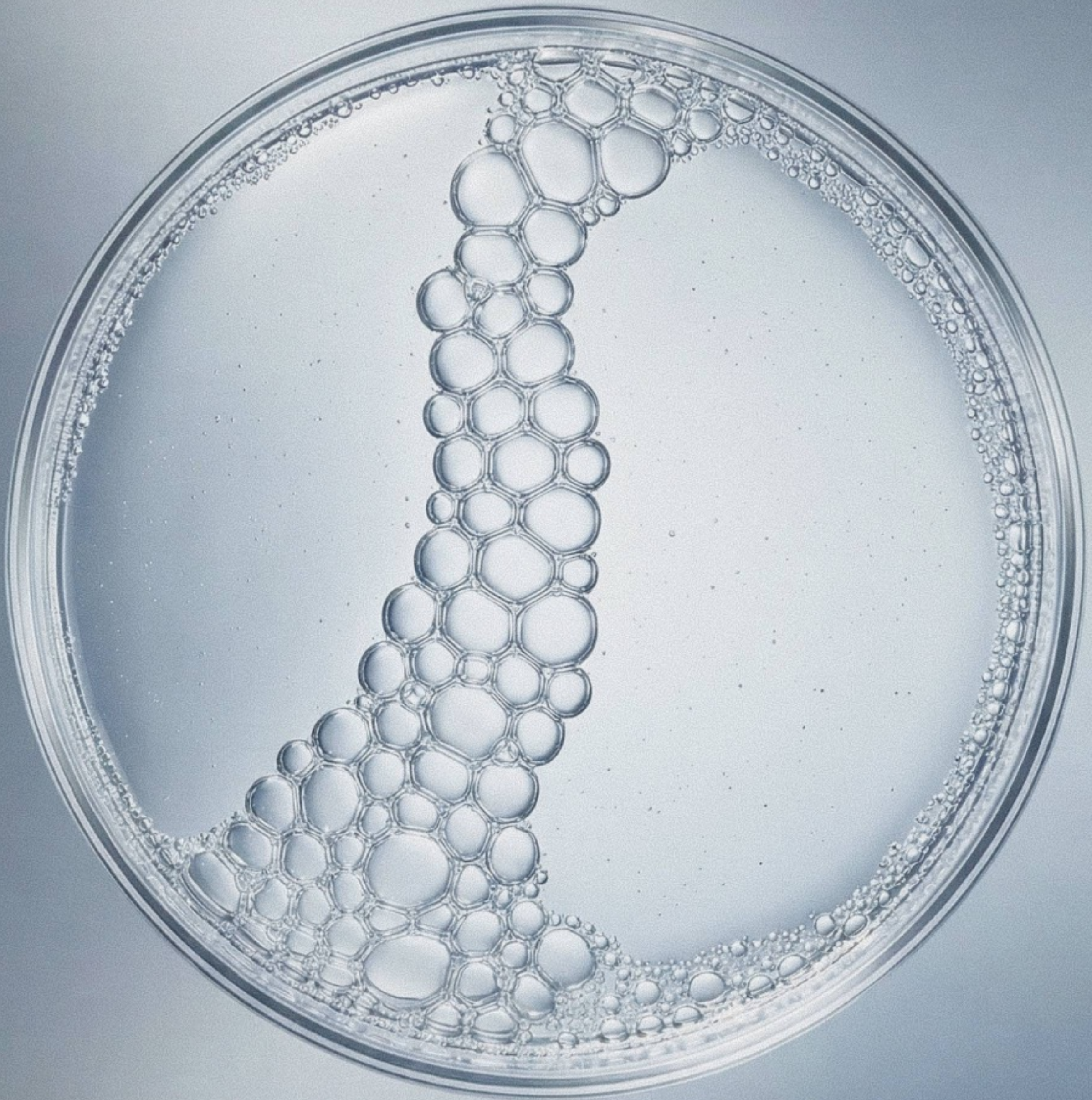
Hydro Retention

Effect: helps support the skin barrier, leaving skin feeling more resilient.

This step helps attract water and hold it in.

Hydration begins when the skin draws in and holds moisture. Water must be able to enter the skin, including from ingredients that help support hydration on the surface. A strong barrier helps reduce water loss and helps the skin stay comfortable.

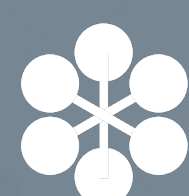
Holding onto water and reducing moisture loss.

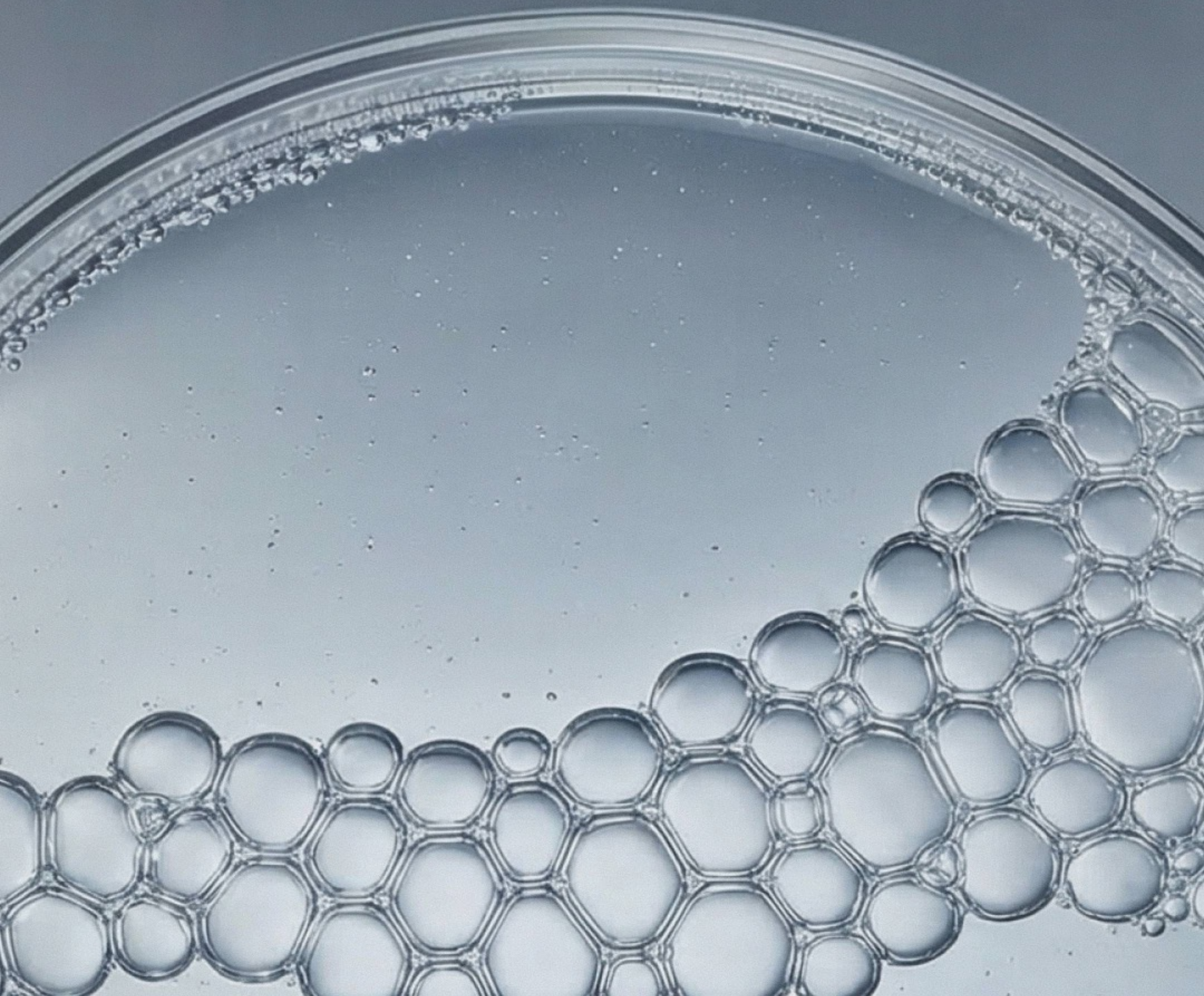

*H*³ — Hydro Protection

Protecting hydration and supporting the skin barrier.

If the skin gets dehydrated or loses moisture too quickly, hydration becomes harder to maintain. This level helps support the skin's protective barrier, helps maintain moisture, and improves comfort.

The barrier does more than protect the skin. It also helps moisture stay where it is needed. This helps the skin maintain its moisture balance.

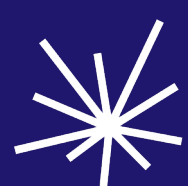
Molecules for a youthful looking appearance from the ocean

Ectoine is a naturally occurring molecule produced by microorganisms living in extreme environments like salt lakes, deserts, and thermal springs. It helps maintain stability under harsh conditions.

Ectoine helps keep skin feeling comfortable while supporting the skin's moisture barrier.

NMN (nicotinamide mononucleotide) is a naturally-occurring molecule involved in cellular activity, associated with key coenzymes such as NAD+.

It helps support the appearance of revitalized, refreshed-looking skin and overall skin vitality.

NMN – Supporting skin vitality

As we age, NAD+ levels naturally decline, and with them the skin's ability to renew itself and maintain a healthy appearance.

NMN helps the skin:

- look fresher and smoother
- feel more firm, smooth, and supported
- maintain a more youthful appearance by helping support the skin's natural renewal

*A coenzyme is an auxiliary molecule that binds to enzymes and helps them carry out key biochemical reactions in the cell.
